



Subject: Proof of Delivery (POD) Change of Process during COVID-19

10 March 2020

In the interest of everyone's safety and wellbeing during the Coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak, ANC will <u>substitute</u> <u>proof of delivery signatures with this effective alternative to minimise contact with others</u>, as per key hygiene recommendations by the Department of Health.

- 1. customer/receiver signs original order docket or a blank piece of paper, using their own pen
- 2. driver takes photos of goods on site with signed paper, geotagged for proof of location
- 3. driver types into their own device the customer/receivers name (as per current processes) and completes the process with a **X** in place of the customer/receiver signature

Our driver teams will be required to complete all three tasks. Driver teams are asked to carry a small pad of paper for use if the customer does not have any. Please politely ask the customer to use their own pen to avoid human to human contact. Once photographed, the customer will retain and dispose of the signed paper. This change in procedure will come into effect **Wednesday 11 March 2020**.

At the same time, ANC will cease using thank you cards until further notice.

ANC has tested this method, is briefing our driver teams through toolbox sessions, is briefing our clients, and are confident this is an effective proof of delivery to protect the goods in transit, and most importantly, everyone throughout the supply chain.


